## Background – School Pulse Panel

- Executive Order 14000 directed the Department of Education to collect data needed to understand COVID-19 education effects
- The American Rescue Plan Act provided funds and direction to collect and report information about COVID-19 and education to IES
- Developed in partnership with other Federal Agencies
- Primary source of information on school, teacher, and student experiences related to COVID-19 in public schools, as reported by school administrators
- First collection in September 2021; conducted by web monthly from January 2022 through December 2022
- Data are considered experimental rather than official statistics

## Background – School Pulse Panel

- Congress provided funds directly to NCES to continue SPP with new collections
- The 2023-24 SPP is currently ongoing and will continue monthly through June 2024
  - Changes from the 2022 SPP include:
    - A larger sample (3,998 stateside)
    - A smaller incentive (\$400/month to \$200/month)
    - An expanded topic focus beyond COVID-19 effects on education
    - **Similarities** to the 2022 SPP include:
      - Web only
      - 30-minute monthly survey open for two weeks each month
      - Designed to be answered by the principal or similar individual
      - U.S. Outlying Area collection
      - Data release ~7-8 weeks after the end of each monthly data collection
      - Data are still considered to be "experimental"

#### • 2023 Topics include:

• Learning recovery, attendance, facilities, concussions, staff vacancies, school lunch and supply chain issues

#### School Pulse Data

- Estimates by school level, neighborhood poverty, region, locale, school size, school racial composition
  - No state- or district-level estimates
  - Average 1,600 responses per month
- Excel datafile
  - No microdata file
- Briefings with stakeholders and press
- Key results posted to interactive dashboard: <u>School Pulse Panel Interactive Results</u> (ed.gov)
- Occasionally infographics and other reports









Percentage of public schools with selected academically oriented facilities


